

CHAPTER 10

TRANSPORTATION AND COMMUNICATIONS

This chapter presents data on length of Federal Highways, National Uniform Licensing Scheme production statistics, rail transportation (passenger and cargo), railway accidents, assets and freight operations.

There are also statistics on civil air transportation (passenger and cargo), aircraft movement, (international and domestic), ocean-borne commerce, cargo and vessel tonnages, crude petroleum oil shipped at crude oil terminals, container traffic, etc.

Similarly, data are presented on Nigerian Postal Service (NIPOST), which provides mail processing and delivery within Nigeria as well as total number of Post Office Boxes and Private Mail Bags available by State.

The telecommunications industry in Nigeria is regulated by the Federal Government, through the Ministry of Information and Communications, Nigerian Communications Commission and the National Frequency Management Council. The telecommunications environment is presently characterized healthy competition, increasingly discerning consumers and vigilant regulators. Available services include Fixed Telephony, Mobile Telephony, Internet Services and other value added services. There is evidence of rapid growth in demand, usage, density and coverage, making Nigeria the fastest-growing telecoms market on the African continent. The growth in telecom service delivery from 1999 to 2003, for instance, is unprecedented.

CHART 24: NET REGISTERED TONNAGE OF VESSELS ENTERED IN NIGERIAN PORTS, 1999 - 2003

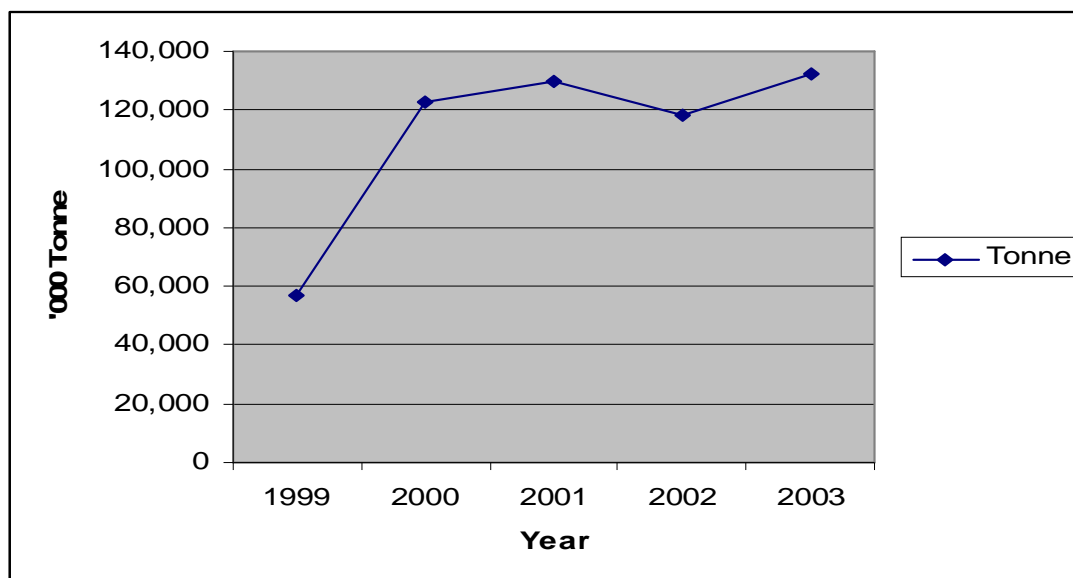

CHART 25: TOTAL CONNECTED PHONE LINES, 2003 - 2007

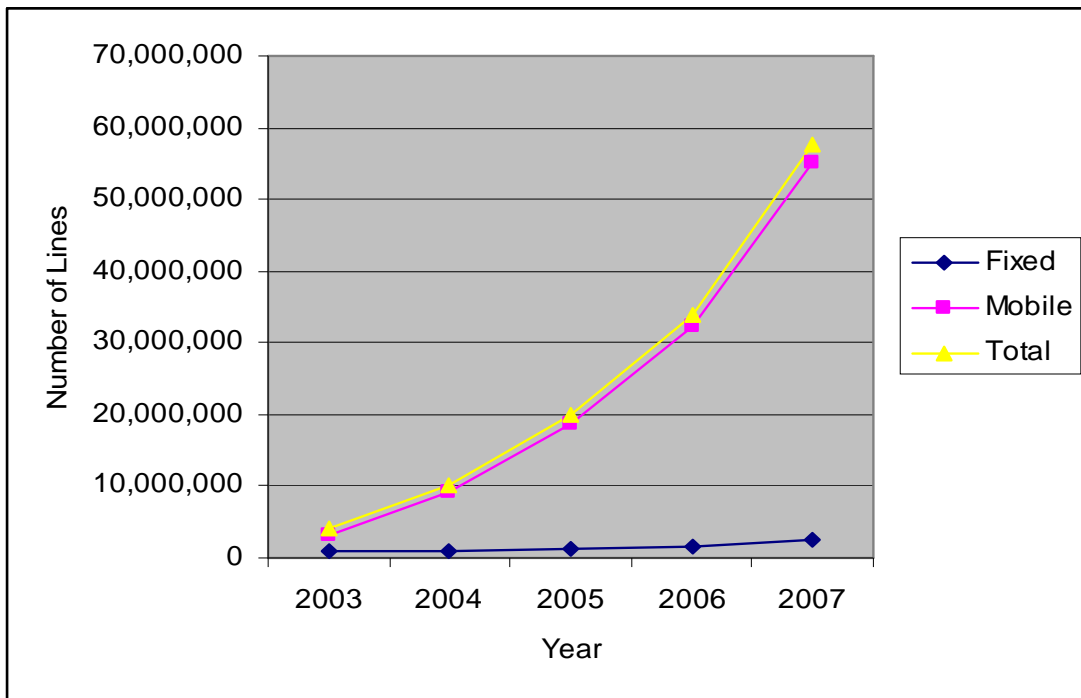
