Gender statistics is not a distinct discipline. It cuts across other statistical domains such as health statistics, education statistics, employment statistics, and so on, all of which identify, develop, and disseminate statistics that represent the realities of women and men's lives in a given culture.

The terms "Sex" and "Gender" are frequently misunderstood by certain statisticians and consumers. The biological differences between women and men are referred to as sex. It is set in stone and cannot be altered. Gender, on the other hand, refers to the socially constructed roles, attitudes, activities, and characteristics that a society believes proper for women and men.

As the coordinator of the National Statistical System, the National Bureau of Statistics has incorporated gender statistics into its data production, by ensuring that statistics are disaggregated by gender. In order to analyze gender issues, data must be disaggregated by sex. Gender statistics include sex disaggregated data, which is an essential component. This bulletin summarizes statistical data in an easy-to-understand infographics, and raising statistical knowledge of the general public.

As a result, the first quarter bulletin concentrate on four key areas: (i) Power and Decision-Making- Do men and women have equal access to decision-making and power sharing at all levels? (ii) Health- Is there still unequal access to health care and services? (iii) Population- Is the country overpopulated with women or men? What about the elderly? (iv) Education- Is there equal access to education for men and women?





Share of Female Deputy Governorship Aspirants





Aspirants For Senatorial Position



PERCENTAGE SHARE OF WOMEN AS PRESIDENTIAL AND VICE PRESIDENTIAL 2019- 2022





Number of Secretaries to the Government of the Federation (SGF) from 1999 – 2019 by Sex




Since return to Democracy in 1999, Nigeria has not produced a female Secretaries to the Government of the Federation (SGF)

1999-2021 Senatorial Appointment






REPORTED CASES OF PREGNANT WOMEN WITH MALARIA BY YEAR


Under-5 mortality is the probability of a child dying between birth and the fifth birthday, that is, before the fifth birthday.

National Average of pregnant women who had 4 or more antenatal care visits in 2018




ANTENATAL CARE RECEIVED FROM SKILLED PERSONNEL

According to NDHS 2018, result shows that 67% of women who gave birth 5 years preceding the survey received antenatal care from a skilled provider.












Estimated Number of Elderly Population (60+ Yrs)

Population Growth Rate as at 2021



LITERACY RATE IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE AMONG YOUNG WOMEN AND MEN AGE 15-24





Total Undergraduate New Entrants by UTME/DE Entry Mode – 2019





UNDERGRADUATE ENROLMENT BY INSTITUTION - 2019




UNDERGRADUATE ENROLMENT BY INSTITUTION OWNERSHIP 2019
