## PREFACE

The Social Statistics Report 2012 is a comprehensive compilation of the contemporary social situation in Nigeria. The Report presents a variety of social and economic indicators with which quality of life can be measured, in most cases, over the last four years.

The survey and sample design from which most of the data were collected emanated from the concerted efforts of the following departments of the Bureau: Demography and Social Statistics, Real Sector and Household Statistics, as well as Field Services & Methodology Departments. The coverage was a complete enumeration of all Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) Federal, State and Local Government levels, including academic and research institutions.

Administrative Statistics from records of relevant subject matter Ministries, Parastatals and Statistical Agencies were mostly used. In most instances, time series data sets spanning 2006 to 2011 are presented. Statistics over this time frame on annual basis formed the benchmark for measuring the social as well as economic conditions of the citizenry of Nigeria. The themes covered in the Report include education, health, housing conditions, households, employment, public safety (road accidents & crime), population/vital registration, the Legislature and Communication, transportation, energy, as well as religion. For ease of reference, the Social Statistics Report has been split into Parts I-IV. **This current Report, Part I, contains the first two chapters of the Social Statistics Report and presents statistics on Households and Housing Conditions in Nigeria.**

I would like to seize the opportunity to thank the Planning, Research and Statistics Departments in the relevant MDAs, who have been very helpful in providing the data needs for the various components of this Report. Agencies that were, for any reasons, unable to respond to our data request are encouraged to assist the Bureau, by providing the required information in a timely manner in future compilations. This is necessary for the production of timely, accurate and reliable data series that is relevant for government policy formulation, and public evaluation of socio-economic development.

It is therefore my pleasure to present the Social Statistics Report 2012 to policymakers, students, researchers, the business community, development partners, and the general public. National Bureau of Statistics welcomes suggestions and constructive comments on any part of this document.

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## **CHAPTER ONE**

### **HOUSEHOLD**

A household is defined as group of persons living together and maintaining unique eating arrangement. It can also be a person living and eating alone. This chapter presents data on demographic characteristics of persons living in households. It also shows the spread, placement or location, within a particular area. The economic and social development of a nation may be determined by its demographic variables like the structure of the population.

#### **1.1 Household Size by State and Sex:**

During the period under review (2006 – 2010) as observed in Table 1.1, households had more male than female members. On the state basis, Yobe state led with 54.7 percent in 2010 for male, while Osun with 52.6 percent had the highest number of female members. The largest household size was recorded in Jigawa state with 6.6 percent in 2009 and 2010; both Kogi and Ondo states recorded 3.1 percent each as the least in 2010.

#### **1.2 Percentage Distribution of Household Heads by State and Size**

In the four years (2007 – 2010) as seen in Table 1.2, male-headed households had the highest with 83.5 percent, 83.7 percent, 86.8 percent, 83.0 percent and 85.2 percent respectively. In 2009, Yobe state (98.8 percent) recorded the highest percentage of male headed households, while in 2010, Bauchi and Zamfara states ranked highest (98.8 percent). Ekiti state (31.6 percent) recorded the highest number of females in 2009 while Enugu state in 2010 recorded the highest with about 35.4 percent of female headed households.

#### **1.3 Average Household Size by state and sector:**

In both years (2007 and 2008), Table 1.4 shows that rural areas recorded the highest average household size of 4.7 and 5.4 respectively as compared to 4.0 and 4.6 in urban area.

## **CHAPTER TWO**

### **HOUSING CONDITION**

Housing could be considered as one of the greatest challenges of man's basic needs. Housing conditions, in terms of housing patterns, roofing, walling, flooring materials and other infrastructural facilities that make up the house, play diverse roles in measuring the standard of living/dwelling. A dynamic and buoyant housing condition is a sign of a strong investment, and a veritable indication of future economic growth and social development.

#### **2.1 Household by type of Tenure:**

The data in Table 2.1 on distribution of households by state and type of tenure (2007 and 2010) shows that Normal Rent accounted for 21.1 percent in 2007 although it rose to 22.0 per cent in 2009, but suddenly declined sharply to 16.1 percent in 2010. Free rent also fluctuated between 2007 and 2010 in the same manner. The percentage of owner occupiers increased between 2007 and 2010 from 67.1 percent to 68.0 percent, while "rented" status declined from 21.1% to 16.1% during the period.

#### **2.2 Household by Type of Marital Status:**

The disaggregation of household by age, marital status and state according to Table 2.2 shows that the number of persons with "married" status rose from 36% in 2009 to 36.5% in 2010. Of this however, "married (monogamous)" rose from 28.4% to 29.4% while "married (polygamous)" declined from 7.6% to 7.1%. The percentage of "never married" persons also rose from 59.2% to 59.3%.

#### **2.3 Household by major source of water for drinking & cooking:**

The percentage of households with access to "pipeborne water" declined from 10.4% in 2008 to 9.5% in 2010. Access to "Borehole/hand pump" type source also declined from 26.8% in 2008 to 21.5% in 2010. On the other hand, the percentage distribution of households with access to naturally-occurring water sources (including rainwater, wells, springs etc) rose from 44.3% in 2008 to 66% in 2010.

#### **2.4 Household by type of Refuse disposal:**

According to table 2.5, there was a marked improvement in disposal systems across the country. The percentage of households with "refuse disposal collected by government agency" rose from 3.5% in 2007 to 4.2% in 2010.

The percentage of households with “unauthorised refuse heap” however fell from 44.9% to 38.5% in 2010, as did the percentage of households with “disposal within compound”, which declined from 37.8% in 2007 to 37.6% in 2010.

## **2.5 Household by type of Toilet Facility:**

As seen in table 2.6, the percentage of households using modern toilet facilities (e.g flush to sewage, flush to septic tank) declined from 13.7% in 2007 to 11.6% in 2010.

## **2.6 Household by type of Housing unit:**

Table 2.7 presents data on percentage distribution of households by type of housing units. Of all the types of units on record, “single-room” appears the most dominant. The percentage of households living in single-room stood at 68.6% in 2007, although it declined to 59.2% in 2010, while the percentage of households living in “flats” and “whole building” increased from 6.3% and 23.7% respectively in 2007 to 7.2% and 32.4% in 2010.

## **2.7 Household by type of Fuelling for Cooking**

Table 2.8 shows that use of firewood remains the dominant source of cooking fuel in many households. In 2007, 74.1% of households used “wood” as cooking fuel, although this declined to 72.2% in 2010. The percentage of households using “electricity” also declined from 0.7% to 0.4% in 2010. However, the percentage of households using kerosene rose from 22.9% in 2007 to 23.8% in 2010.

## **2.8 Household by type of building embarked upon**

Residential buildings remain the dominant type of Buildings embarked upon by most persons with 93.3% of persons embarking on this type of building in 2008, according to table 2.10. This stayed largely unchanged in 2010. Preference for “Industrial” building also rose from 0.5% in 2008 to 1.3% in 2010, but “commercial” buildings rose the fastest from 4.6% to 5.4% between 2008 and 2010.
