

DOMESTIC AIR PASSENGER TRAFFIC- Jan 2012 to Dec 2013

APRIL 2014

SUMMARY

Air transport contributed N32.6 billion to Nigeria's "rebased" GDP in 2010, N36.6bn in 2011, N42.7bn in 2012 and 48.8 bn in 2013 representing an average of 4.8% of transport and storage sector and an average of 0.05% of total nominal GDP during the period.

The sector grew at a comound average growth rate of 14.3 percent between 2010 and 2013.

The table below indicates passenger air travel between 2012 and 2013 indicating an increase of 1.3 percent between 2012 and 2013.

About 50 percent of average total passenger air travel between 2012 and 2013 were via Lagos airports (domestic and international), while about 25 percent were through Abuja airports. Together Lagos and Abuja airports were responsible for over 75% of total air passenger travel for both 2012 and 2013.
