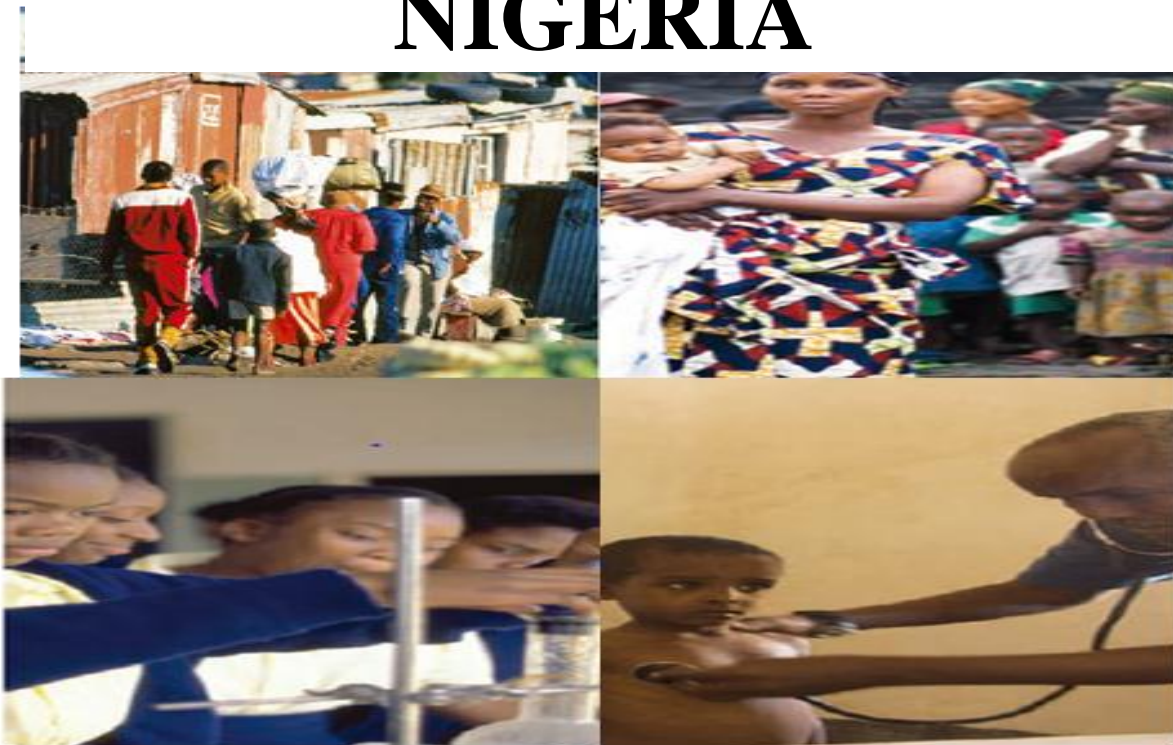

PREFACE

The Social Statistics Report 2012 is a comprehensive compilation of the contemporary social situation in Nigeria. The Report presents a variety of social and economic indicators with which quality of life can be measured, in most cases, over the last four years.

The survey and sample design from which most of the data were collected emanated from the concerted efforts of the following departments of the Bureau: Demography and Social Statistics, Real Sector and Household Statistics, as well as Field Services & Methodology Departments. The coverage was a complete enumeration of all Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) Federal, State and Local Government levels, including academic and research institutions.

Administrative Statistics from records of relevant subject matter Ministries, Parastatals and Statistical Agencies were mostly used. In most instances, time series data sets spanning 2006 to 2011 are presented. Statistics over this time frame on annual basis formed the benchmark for measuring the social as well as economic conditions of the citizenry of Nigeria. The themes covered in the Report include education, health, housing conditions, households, employment, public safety (road accidents & crime), population/vital registration, the legislature, communication, transportation, energy as well as religion. For ease of reference, the Social Statistics Report has been split into Parts I-IV. **This current Report, Part III, contains four chapters of the 2012 Social Statistics Report (SSR) and presents statistics on Health, Employment, Public safety, Population and vital registration in Nigeria.**

I would like to seize the opportunity to thank the Planning, Research and Statistics Departments in the relevant MDAs, who have been very helpful in providing the data needs for the various components of this Report. Agencies that were, for any reasons, unable to respond to our data request are encouraged to assist the Bureau, by providing the required information in a timely manner in future compilations. This is necessary for the production of timely, accurate and reliable data series that is relevant for government policy formulation, and public evaluation of socio-economic development.

It is therefore my pleasure to present the Social Statistics Report 2012 to policymakers, students, researchers, the business community, development partners, and the general public. National Bureau of Statistics welcomes suggestions and constructive comments on any part of this document.

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CHAPTER ONE

HEALTH

Today's world is busy and demanding, hence there is need to ensure optimal performance in the health sector. According to WHO, health simply means the complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity. It is the journey towards the highest levels of mental, emotional and physical stability. The main sources of data for this chapter are derived from the Federal Ministry of Health, the National Agency for Food, Drugs and Administration and Control (NAFDAC), the Federal Ministry of Water Resources Multiple Indicators Cluster Survey (MICS) and NBS/CBN/NCC socio – Economic Survey on Nigeria.

Table 1.2a shows that the number of reporting cases increased from 2.99 million in 2007 to 3.11 million in 2010, and is projected to reach 3.3 million in 2011 (Table 1.2b). Benue and Akwa Ibom have double-digit HIV prevalence rates of 12.7% and 10.9% respectively, while Kebbi has the least at 1%. The national average declined from 5.0% in 2003 to 4.1% in 2010.

According to Table 1.5, the number of reported cases of notifiable diseases rose from 6.8m in 2007 to 7.6million in 2008, but declined to 6.10million in 2011. However, there were 5,924 deaths reported in 2011, compared to 17,116 in 2007.

As shown in Table 1.7a In 2011, the number of NAFDAC registered products stood at 8335 compared to 5948 in 2007. The drugs category (mostly imported) represented 39% of registered products in 2007 but this declined to 29% in 2011, while the share of products (food, cosmetics, medical services, pre-packaged water) rose.

The number of deaths reported from malaria declined to 1608 in 2011 from 2620 in 2007 (See Table 1.14)

CHAPTER TWO EMPLOYMENT

Employment is the contract between two parties, one being the employer and the other being the employee. The Employer conceives of a productive activity generally with the aim of generating income, and the employee contributes labour to the enterprise usually in return for remuneration. Employment also exists in the public, non-profit and household sectors. An employer is any entity that hires employees; it can be a person, an organisation or a corporation.

Table 2.1 presents a summary of industrial disputes between 2004 and 2008. While there were 36 disputes in 2004, this increased to 189 in 2006 and nearly 300 in 2008. 26 disputes resulted in strike actions in 2004, compared to 93 in 2008. A total of 127,377 workers were involved in the disputes of 2004 but a considerably larger number (868,907) were involved in 2008. Overall, 2,626,399 man-days were lost in 2004, compared to 8,974,981 in 2008. Community, social and personal services was the industry with the highest number of disputes at 231,067 records.

According to Table 2.8, unemployment rate in 2011 stood at 23.9% at the national level. Among States, Zamfara State had the highest unemployment rate in 2011 (42.6%) while Osun State had the lowest (3%). Female unemployment was also higher in 2011 at 24.3%, compared to male unemployment rate of 23.5%. According to age categories, the age groups 15-24 and 25-44 had higher unemployment rates as well: 37.7% and 22.4% respectively. Rural unemployment stood at 25.6% compared to urban unemployment of 17.1%.

CHAPTER THREE

PUBLIC SAFETY

This chapter discusses cases of road accidents, prison admission, inmate population, fire outbreaks, flood disasters and statistics on police formations around the country.

Table 3.1 shows reported cases of road accidents in Nigeria from 2005 to 2010. Out of a total of 20910 reported cases, 9,092 were classified as “serious”, while 6,853 were regarded as “fatal”. This was a considerable rise compared to 2009 when 5,450 reported cases were classed as “serious” and 4,683 were regarded as “fatal”, out of a total of 13,703. In 2010, a total of 45,506 persons were involved in road accidents, of which 10,793 were killed and 34,713 injured. This was more than double the recorded cases of 2009. FCT reported the highest number of road accidents in 2010 at 5330 while Kebbi reported the least, at 48.

With respect to prison admission, table 3.7 shows a drop by about 50% of prison admissions for age groups under-16 and 17-20 between 2010 and 2011. On the other hand, prison admissions for the age group over-51 stood at 3,446 in 2011 compared to 3541 in 2010. Of all types of prison admissions, prisoners awaiting trial constituted the largest group at 66,920, out of a total of 131,532 recorded in 2011 (table 3.8). By religion, Christians accounted for 46,706 prisoners while Atheists were 6,073. There were a total of 125,438 male prisoners compared to 6,094 female prisoners in 2011. Overall, there were 131,532 prison admissions in 2011, compared to 171,881 admissions in 2010. In 2011, most of the prison admissions (11,504) were for “Stealing”.

In 2011, there were 259 calls regarding domestic private fires, out of which 245 lives were lost. This is compared to 6 industrial/factory fires reported, out of which 22 lives were lost, in 2011. An estimated 3.8 billion Naira worth of goods were lost in the industrial fires while loss estimates for the domestic fires was put at 14.6 billion Naira (Table 3.14)

In 2011, a total of 195,703 drivers’ licences were processed by the Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC), with Lagos State accounting for 64,959 and Kebbi State, 629 of these (Table 3.17)

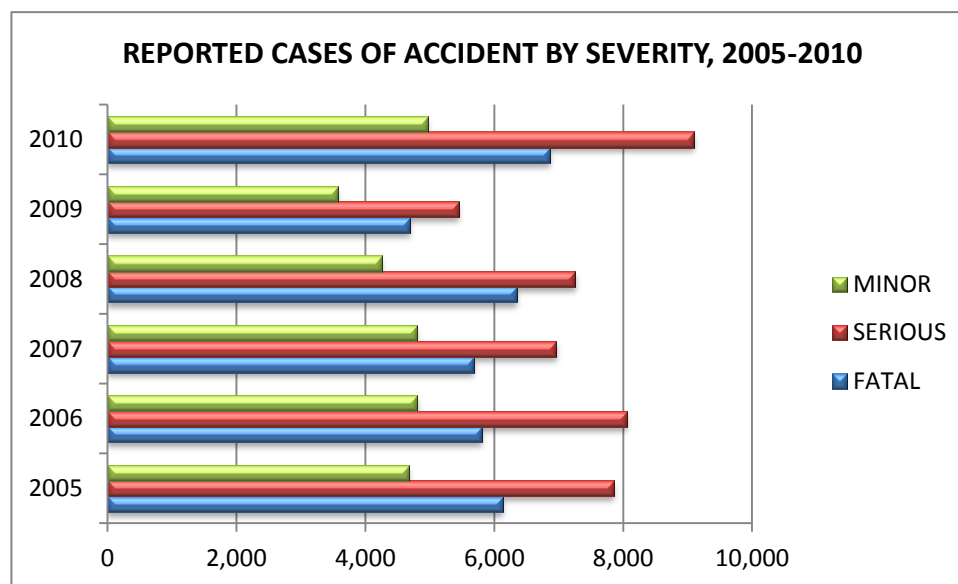

NUMBER OF PERSONS REPORTED KILLED IN ROAD ACCIDENTS, 2006-2010

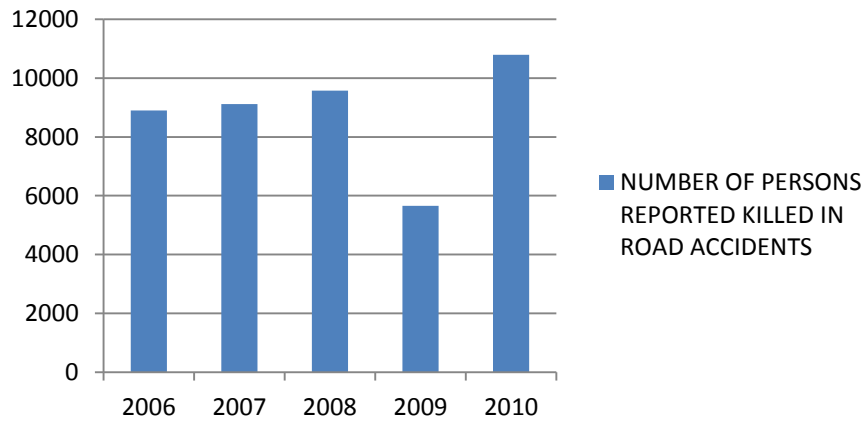

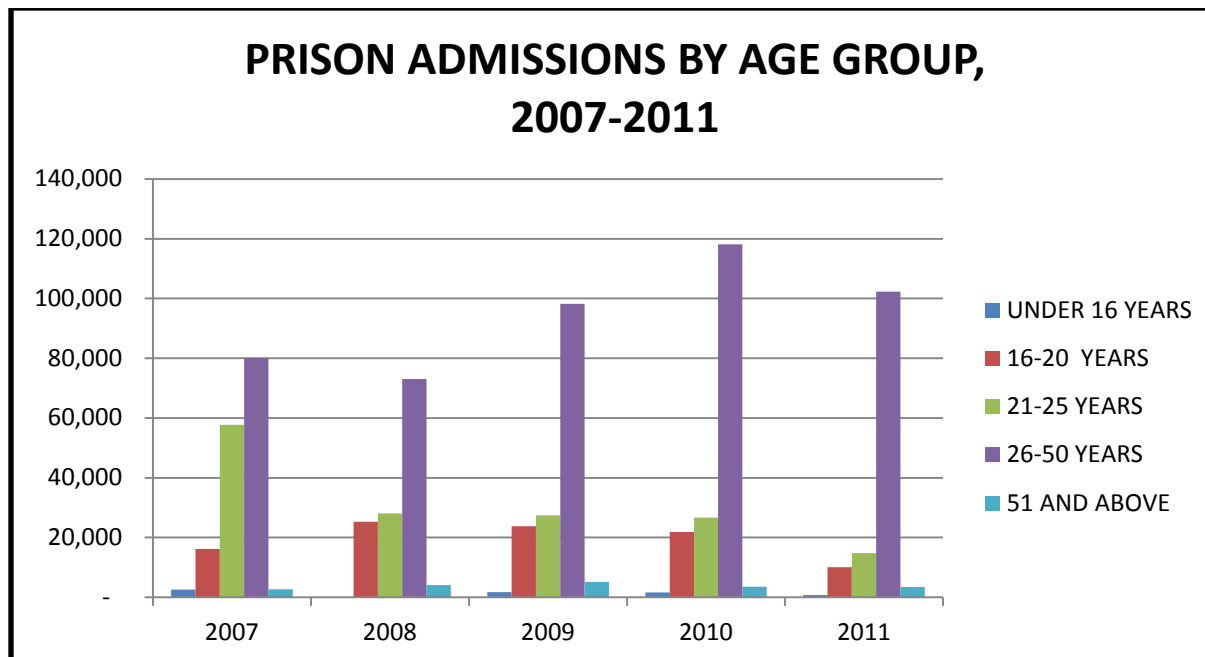

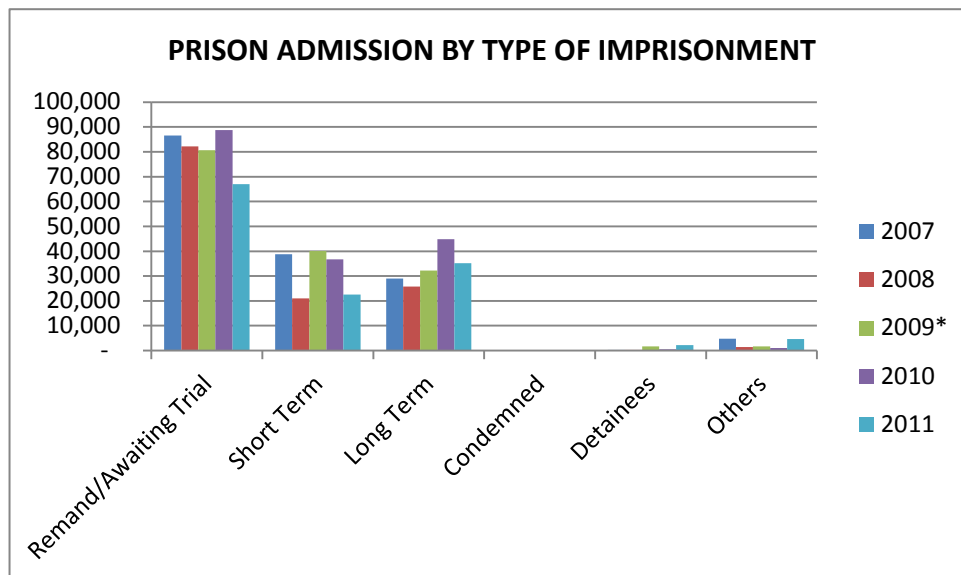

CHAPTER FOUR

POPULATION AND VITAL REGISTRATION

Information about the growth, movements, structures, living conditions, spatial distribution and natural resources of a country's population is vital for relevant policy formulation, planning and implementation and for monitoring and evaluation. Thus, collection and analysis of data on population and development-related issues play a fundamental role in policy making. With the 2006 census population census being the most recent census, population-related information has remained key to planning processes.

Based on the outcomes of the 2006 Population and Housing Census, Table 7.2 shows the projected population of Nigeria in 2007 to be 144,897,327. Disaggregated by sex, males accounted for 73,616,426. In 2011, population was projected to be 164,294,516: 83,482,348 males and 80,812,168 females.
