## PUBLIC STATEMENT ON WORLD STATISTICS DAY 2015

The National Bureau of Statistics, today, joins the global statistical community to celebrate the 2015 World Statistics Day. This year's event holds special significance for us at the Bureau in two key respects. It is the first Statistics Day commemorative event since the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Agenda was launched last month in New York, setting the stage for a rapid increase in the demand and use of key development data. We are fortunate to have been an important part of efforts to achieve the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and commit ourselves no less to new initiatives aimed at achieving the SDGs.

Secondly, it is the first Statistics Day celebration since the political transition that took place in Nigeria earlier this year. We have witnessed tremendous interest in socio-economic data that adequately reflects developments not only at the macroeconomic level, but also at regional and state levels.
